# Clarify Constraints and Your Critical Path

## Eliminate Constraints to Your Project's Success

#### Look at all the task in your dependency tree

- Which tasks pose the largest constraint on your success? For instance:
  - Time required
  - Risk of failure or other uncertainty
  - Scope-limiting resource and effort requirements
- What might you do to reduce or eliminate those constraints?
- How might you accelerate or extend your impact by eliminating those constraints?

# Critical Path Analysis

"Estimate the time required to do each task. Add up all the sequential times to your goal to see which path will take longest.

The longest path through these sequential items is your critical path; the path that you must follow as quickly as possible to your goal. Highlight the lines connecting those items on the critical path to make it quite obvious (on your dependency tree). "

- Focus your best resources on quickly derisking these tasks as early as possible
